TPV for Independent Economic Household Worksheet

Lifeline is a government program that provides a monthly discount on home or mobile telephone services. Only one lifeline discount is allowed per household. Members of a household are not permitted to receive Lifeline service from multiple telephone companies. Your household is everyone who lives together at your address as one economic unit, including children and people who are not related to you.

The adults you live with are part of your economic unit if they continue to share in the income and expenses of the household. An adult is any person 18 years of age or older, or an emancipated minor which is a person under age 18 who is legally considered to be an adult.

Household expenses include food, health care expenses such as medical bills and the cost of renting or paying a mortgage on your place, for example a house or apartment and utilities including water, heat and electricity. Income includes salary, public assistance benefits, social security benefits, pensions, unemployment compensation, veteran's benefits, inheritances, alimony, child support payments, worker's compensation benefits, gifts, and lottery winnings.

Spouses and domestic partners are considered to be part of the same household. Children under the age of 18 living with their parents or guardians are considered to be part of the same household as their parents or guardians. If an adult has no income, or minimal income, and lives with someone who provides financial support to that adult, both people are considered part of the same household.

You are being asked to complete this automated process because government records indicate someone else either has or had Lifeline supported service at your address. This other person may or may not be a part of

your household. Answer the questions below to determine whether there is more than one household residing at your address.

Please key in your 10 digit home phone number.

Please state your full name.

Please state your full address including city, state and zipcode.

Question 1: Does your spouse or domestic partner (that is, someone you are married to or in a relationship with) already receive a Lifeline-discounted phone? Say yes or no.

If you said yes to question 1 you may not sign up for Lifeline because someone in your household already receives Lifeline. Only one lifeline discount is allowed per household.

If you said no to question 1 please answer question 2.

Question 2: Other than a spouse or partner, do other adults (people over the age of 18 or emancipated minors) live with you at your address? Say yes or no.

If you said no to question 2 then you are eligible for lifeline service. You understand that violation of the one-per-household requirement is against the Federal Communication Commission's rules and may result in you losing your Lifeline benefits, and potentially, prosecution by the United States government. Please confirm you understand this by saying yes.

If you said yes to question 2 then respond yes or no to who lives with you:

A parent, yes or no?

An adult son or daughter, yes or no?

Another adult relative (such as a sibling, aunt, cousin, grandparent, grandchild, etc), say yes or no.

An adult roommate, yes or no?

Please state what other adults if any live with you. If none other then say none.

Question 3: If you said yes to question 2 then do you share living expenses (bills, food, etc.) and share income (either your income, the other person's income or both incomes together) with at least one of the adults mentioned, say yes or no?

If you said no to question 3 then your household has multiple household units and you are allowed to have multiple Lifelines at your address. Please confirm you understand this by saying yes.

If you said yes to question 3 then you are stating only one household unit exists at your address and you can't sign up for lifeline service since someone at your address has or had lifeline service. Please confirm you understand this by saying yes.

TPV para Hoja de Trabajo Para Hogar Economico Independiente

Lifeline es un programa gubernamental que brinda un descuento mensual en servicio a domicilio o para teléfono móvil. Sólo un descuento Lifeline está permitido por hogar. A los miembros de una familia no se les permite recibir el servicio Lifeline de varias compañías telefónicas. Su hogar consiste de todos que viven juntos en su dirección como una unidad económica, incluyendo niños y personas que no están relacionadas con usted. Los adultos que viven con usted son parte de su unidad económica si continúan a compartir los ingresos y gastos del hogar. Un adulto es cualquier persona de 18 años de edad o más, o un menor emancipado quien es una persona menor de 18 años que está legalmente considerado como un adulto. Gastos del hogar incluyen comida, gastos de cuidado de la salud--tales como gastos medicos--y el costo de alquiler o el pago de una hipoteca para su lugar; por ejemplo, una casa o un apartamento; y los servicios públicos como el agua, la calefaccion y la electricidad. Los ingresos incluyen salarios, beneficios de asistencia pública, beneficios de la seguridad social, las pensiones, compensación por desempleo, beneficios de veteranos, herencias, pensión alimenticia, los pagos de manutención de niños, beneficios de compensación al trabajador, regalos y premios de lotería.

Los cónyuges y las parejas de hecho se consideran que son parte de la misma casa. Los niños menores de 18 años que viven con sus padres o representantes son considerados como parte de la misma casa con sus padres o tutores. Si un adulto no tiene ingresos, o ingresos mínimos, y vive con alguien que brinda apoyo financiero a ese adulto, ambas personas se consideran parte de la misma casa.

Se le pide completar este proceso automatizado, porque los registros del gobierno indican que alguien tiene o tuvo servicio apoyado por Lifeline en su dirección. Esta otra persona puede o no puede ser una parte de su hogar. Responda a las siguientes preguntas para determinar si hay más de un hogar que reside en su domicilio.

Si usted dijo que no a la pregunta 2, entonces usted es elegible para el servicio Lifeline. Usted entiende que la violación de la obligación de uno por hogar está en contra de las reglas de la Comisión Federal de Comunicaciones y puede resultar en que usted pierda los beneficios de Lifeline y, potencialmente, el enjuiciamiento por el gobierno de los Estados Unidos. Por favor confirma que entiende esto diciendo que sí. Si ha contestado que sí a la pregunta 2, responder sí o no a quien vive con usted:

Si usted dijo que no a la pregunta 3, entonces su hogar tiene múltiples unidades familiares y se le permite tener múltiples líneas Lifeline en su dirección. Por favor confirma que entiende esto diciendo que sí.

Si ha contestado que sí a la pregunta 3 usted está indicando que sólo una unidad doméstica existe en su domicilio y no se puede contratar el servicio de Lifeline ya que alguien en su dirección tiene o ha tenido servicio con Lifeline. Por favor confirma que entiende esto diciendo que sí.
